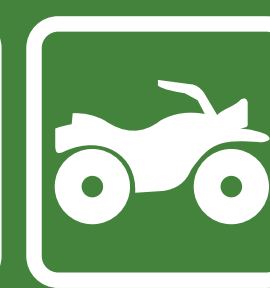


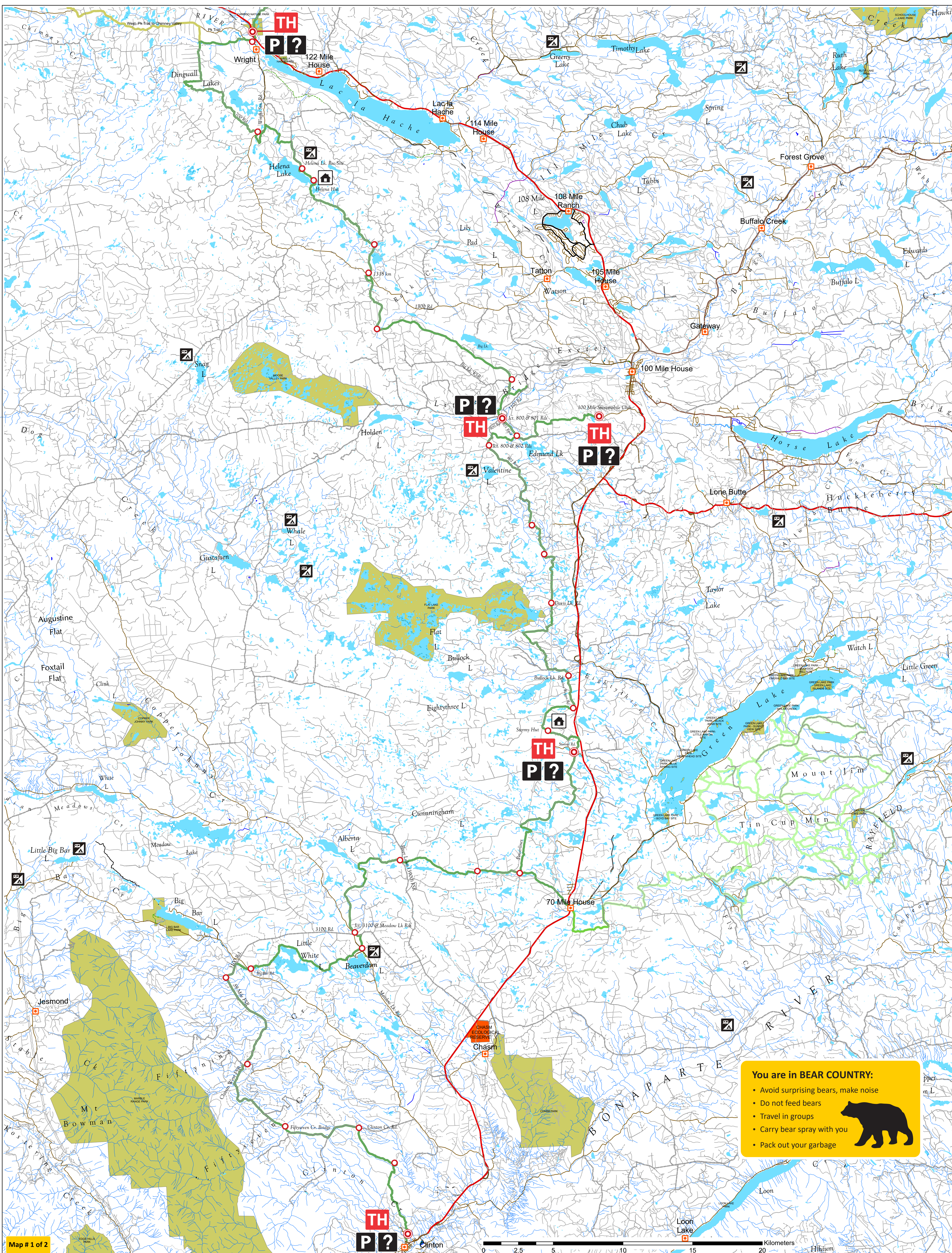


Gold Rush Snowmobile Trail

The **Gold Rush Snowmobile Trail (GRST)** is the longest contiguous off-road vehicle (ORV) trail in British Columbia, traversing a wide range of landscapes and environmental conditions along its 340-plus kilometer path. It is a challenging, rugged and remote trail that requires preparation, knowledge of applicable laws and local customs, route navigation skills and backcountry experience. **THESE TRAILS ARE NOT PATROLLED. USE AT YOUR OWN RISK. BE PREPARED:** pack food and water, extra fuel, bear spray, a reliable communication device, navigation equipment, a basic first aid kit, and emergency supplies. Always travel with a partner, make a trip plan and share that plan with other competent and responsible people, and ensure that you are confident in your abilities and preparation before attempting to use these trails. The Gold Rush Snowmobile Trail is managed as a four-season off-road vehicle trail, and snowmobiling and ATV riding are the primary recreational activities on the trail. The GRST is the only place in B.C. where snowmobiles may legally operate on a Forest Service Road that has been snowplowed during winter. Otherwise, snowmobiling is not permitted on a road if the road has been plowed or is otherwise fit for travel by vehicles other than snowmobiles. Regardless of whether a road has been plowed or not, recreational users should always be aware that they could encounter others using the road, including industrial traffic, and you should therefore **always ride within your limits and under control.**

Secwepemcúl'ecw

The **Gold Rush Snowmobile Trail** is situated within **Secwepemcúl'ecw** (pronounced *shuh-kwehp-im-oo-loo*), the traditional territory of the **Secwépemc** ("Shuh-kwehp-im") (Shuswap) Nation.

The **Secwépemc** are part of the Interior Salish people. The traditional Secwépemc lived as a self-governing nation grouped into bands. Today, there are 17 remaining bands that make up the Secwépemc Nation and three Secwépemc dialects.
